Values and approach

Course content

The course begins with an introduction of concepts such as sustainable development, health, holism and work from an interdisciplinary perspective. This is followed by a review of different concepts of nature, their conditions and view on work. These concepts are then reviewed and problematized using critical analysis and discussion focused on ethics, power, risks and possibilities, historical examples, separate culture and world views as well as esthetics. Finally, the acquired theoretical knowledge in a specific area of work life is applied. The course aims at an interdisciplinary work process, where health is related to a sustainable life environment with technical, social, economical and existential aspects.
