3. present theories and previous research of relevance for the chosen research problem and the research area health-promoting working life
4. plan and, be able to use suitable scientific methods, collect and analyze empirical data
5. conduct an advanced analysis of collected data supported by social science theory and link the analysis to the current state of knowledge in social work
6. write a scientific work that meets academic standards for format as well as good linguistic quality
7. demonstrate the ability to identify limitations and strengths in their own and others' degree projects and make significant contributions in a seminar discussion
8. present and be able to apply ethical research rules and agreements
