**Learning outcomes** Upon completion of the course, the student should, within the field of the course  
- have knowledge about the function of legal rules and legal systematics  
- identify legal problems  
- find and apply legal sources  
- understand how laws and rules are applied  
in order to be able to solve legal problems

**Course content** The course starts with general jurisprudence with orientation in the legal system, legal sources, methods of interpretation and application, basic legal concepts and boundary issues. Furthermore, the relationship between national law and EC law are studied.  
After this, the course is divided into the following main areas:  
o Personal law - deals with who may enter into binding agreements.  
o General property law - subjects studied here are general contract law, consumer law, market law, law of obligations including execution, real estate law, company law, labour law and laws on damages and insurance.  
o Family law - deals mainly with economical and other legal effects of marriage and cohabitation, as well as inheritance law.  
o Administrative law - deals with the relationship between public and private legal entities.

	Here, the term public authority, exercise of authority, public documents and confidentiality are studied.						
	o Criminal and procedural law - deals with the basic principles of criminal and procedural law. basic principles.						
<b>Teaching</b>	Teaching takes place in the form of lectures, group work and presentation of written assignments. The participants must attend a trial.						
<b>Prerequisites</b>	General entry requirements.						
<b>Examination</b>	Examination takes place in the form of a written test in connection with the conclusion of the course. conclusion. For a passing grade in the course it is also required that written assignments have been completed and passed.						
<b>Grade</b>	A, B, C, D, E, Fx, F						
<b>Limitations</b>	Grade F stands for failed, meaning that a new test is required. Grade Fx implies that an existing assignment needs to be supplemented in order to pass (no higher than grade E can be achieved with this procedure). With grade Fx, the student should request supplementation within two weeks after the Fx decision. If this request is not made within the time stated, the student will have to complete a new examination, which may only be done provided place is available at a forthcoming examination. If the student has taken an examination after an Fx decision, the possibility of supplementary qualification lapses.						
<b>Other regulations</b>	This course has, to some extent, the same contents as 2ÄJ99A, Law, Introductory Course for Real Estate Agents, 10 HE credits, and 2HÖ98A, Introduction to Commercial Law, 10 HE credits When issuing a degree, only one of these courses can be included.						
<b>Sustainable environment</b>	A minor part of the course content deals with sustainable development.
