<b>Learning outcomes</b>	On completion of the course students will be able to: 1. Describe and critically analyse the possibilities and limitations of different research methods, and theoretical and epistemological issues of importance to social work. 2. Independently search for, critically examine and evaluate knowledge, especially with a focus on how to verify or falsify hypotheses and discuss credibility issues based on different research designs, as well as compile and present scientific materials. 3. Plan a structural outline for a thesis at the advanced level that examines and analyses one or more research questions.

<b>Examination</b>	Learning objectives 1-2: Individual written examination. Learning objective 3: Author a preliminary thesis plan for the Master's thesis, which is defended during a seminar, as well as opposition of another student's thesis project plan.

<b>Limitations</b>	Students who do not take or who fail the regular examination are offered at least four more opportunities to take the examination. The examination may be taken on one regularly scheduled date and on two additional occasions in connection with the course. Students who have not passed after these three examinations are referred for student counselling/support and may retake the examination the next time the course is offered.
